SPRING GENERAL ELECTION

County Board, School Board, and school spending referendums will highlight the ballots at the spring general election to be held on April 2nd. Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 8:00 p.m. in the auditorium at the Saukville Town Hall. Due to redistricting following the 2000 census, Ozaukee County has divided our town into four Supervisory Districts (versus two districts, previously). As a result, our election workers will have to determine which of 5 ballot types is appropriate for you. Maps of the new supervisory districts and the existing school districts will be available as you enter the polls. Please have patience!

New voters: Wisconsin allows registration on Election Day. Please bring two current documents that show your name and address. Checks and utility bills as well as your driver's license or state identification are acceptable proof of residence.

As the April 2nd election falls during spring break for some schools, some families may be taking vacations. If you wish to vote by absentee ballot, call the town hall for an application.

Welcome to a new year in the town. We are looking forward to the Annual Meeting scheduled for Thursday, April 18th at 7:30 p.m. and hope to see you there.

The past year has been a successful one. The Plan Commission and Town Board have been "fine tuning" the zoning ordinance. As of September 18, 2001, Ordinance 2001-4 increases the maximum total area of individual accessory buildings, including detached garages from 2,000 to 2,500 square feet in the A-4 and A-5 districts. As of December 18, 2001, Ordinance 2002-2 allows repairs, restoration and reconstruction of some non-conforming buildings and structures which are historic in nature and worthy of preservation.

Our zoning map has been re-produced in color which makes it easier to see the zoning classifications and easier in general, to locate specific areas in the town. This project, completed by Bonestroo, Rosene and Anderlik also includes a current voting ward map and school district map. They have done a fine job with these projects.

Snowplowing costs for the season are down due to the unseasonably warm weather and minimal snowfall for the season.

We will be holding an election on April 2, 2002, for County Board, School Board and a school spending referendum. No town board or staff terms are up for election until 2003. We once again would like to thank all those who have volunteered to help during the election.

A REMINDER FROM THE BUILDING INSPECTION DEPARTMENT REGARDING BUILDING PROJECT

With Spring approaching and the temperatures getting warmer, you may be thinking about getting started on home improvement projects. Descriptive handouts to address most of your questions and permit applications are available at Town Hall or by calling our office. Processing of most building permits will take a minimum of seven working days, so please plan accordingly.

In the Town of Saukville, permits are also required for air

conditioners, furnaces, and water heaters/softeners (new or replacements). These permits are valid for one year only. COMM 20.10 and Section 2(j)(1) of the Town Building Code states that substantial work shall be started within 6 months of the date of permit issuance. After one year the permit expires. All projects requiring permits are required to have rough and/or final inspections made by the building inspector. When your project is ready for inspection, please call our office at (262)

375-1349, to make an appointment. Inspections are scheduled Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

Bonestroo, Rosene, Anderlik and Associates, an engineering firm contracted by the Town to produce new zoning, school district and voting district maps have completed the project.

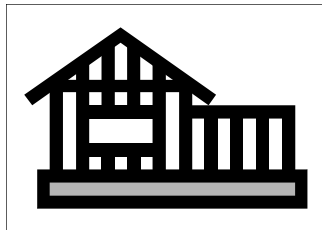

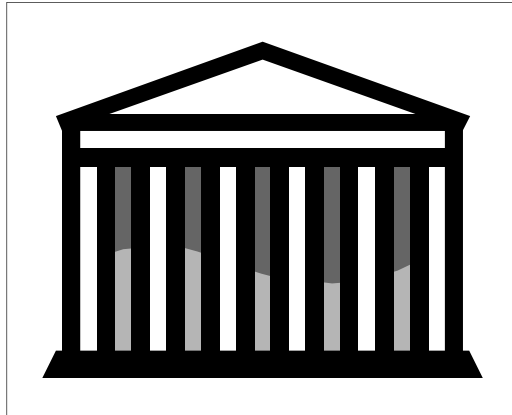
BACK PAGE STORY HEADLINE
