## **TOWN BOARD MINUTES**

March 11, 1998

7:30 p.m.

**1. Call to Order**

Attending:

Chairman: Hoffman

Supervisors: Beverung, Lemke

Clerk: Clarke

**2. Pledge of Allegiance**

**3. Approval of minutes of February 17, 1998 Town Board Meetings.**

Hoffman moved to approve; Beverung seconded; motion carried.

**4. Discussion/action on bartender's license.**

Thomas Aranow of Riveredge Nature Center's application did not indicate whether he had taken the requisite safe beverage course. Hoffman moved to table; Beverung seconded; motion carried.

**5. Discussion/action on picnic liquor license.**

Riveredge Nature Center applied for a one day picnic liquor license. It was noted that because item 4 was tabled to the next board meeting, the event may not have a bartender. Hoffman moved to rescind the motion in item 4 above. Beverung seconded; motion carried. Beverung moved to approve the Aranow bartender's license, pending proof of certification of passing the bartender's class, and the picnic license; Lemke seconded; motion carried.

**6. Update/discussion on proposed Milwaukee bridge crossing.**

Hoffman presented a brief summary of the bridge situation. He indicated that the village had requested a meeting with the board on March 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. The location of meeting will be announced when known. Citizen Roger Boll then described the history of the bridge crossing proposal. A number of citizens then addressed the board on the issue. All expressed concern over one of the two possible crossing sites: Cold Spring and Center Road. Those living near each site were opposed the proximate site and most supported enlarging the current bridge to 4 lanes to eliminate the need for a second bridge. Generally, the citizens wanted to maintain the rural character of the town and did not feel that a major truck crossing was compatible. Many thought that the village had created the problem with their industrial park expansion and that the town should not have to bear the brunt of solving the problem.

**7. Building Inspector's Report**

Hoffman summarized the report which is on file.

**8. Recycling Report**

**a) Tires handout**

Beverung reported that a handout is now available at the recycling center describing how to dispose of old tires.

**b) Weeknight operation**

Beverung indicated that as an alternate, it may be possible for town residents to dump trash and recycle at the Arrow Disposal site during weekday work hours. Lemke also said that Arrow could contract for short term, summer pickup. Beverung will follow-up.

**9. Building Operation & Maintenance**

**a) Survey of town hall lot lines.**

Danielson reported that she had gotten three estimates for \$1000, \$400, and free. The free estimate is an associate of Dave Phillipps. She will follow-up.

**10. Roads Report**

**a) Discussion/action on excavation ordinance.**

Hoffman asked for comments on the ordinance proposal. Sample ordinances were then discussed. Hoffman supported issuing a permit with or without a fee. The building administrator would be charged with monitoring the excavation. Lemke supported the concept because the town office would be aware of the activity and a contact person would be available in case of problems. Hoffman will discuss the matter with Dave Phillipps and present a draft fee structure at the April meeting. Hoffman moved to table the matter until April; Lemke seconded; motion carried.

**b) Other road items.**

Lemke reported on the problems with our gravel roads during the mild weather. Until there is sufficient drying, there is not much that can be done to improve the surface. Danielson reported that the “hidden drive” sign is now in place at the Field Station on Blue Goose Rd.

**11. Clerk’s & Treasurer’s Reports**

Danielson and Clarke presented the Treasurer’s and Clerk’s reports respectively. The reports are on file. Hoffman moved to approve these reports; Beverung seconded; motion carried.

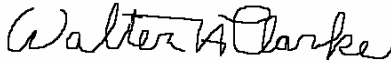
Hoffman reported that the County sanitation department has requested that our building inspector should inspect the plumbing in the house as well as the new septic system. This will be discussed with the building inspector.
